We are continuing down the road of furlough. We have criss-crossed the Eastern United States several times and met some wonderful people along the way. We have met new friends and even have received new recipes to try out.

In late December, we were finally able to connect with some doctors for Jerry. We found him a tremendous cardiologist, endocrinologist, a diabetic self-management specialist and a cardiac rehab specialist. He is trying to spend time walking every day and has changed his diet. Liz contracted vertigo at the same time. While she is being treated, she is still not quite able to drive, though she is gradually getting better.

We have seen some wonderful results in our meetings. As of this writing, twelve have trusted Christ as Savior, dozens have gone forward for security of salvation and consecration, and at least 86 people have dedicated their lives to be missionaries!!!

Liz had the opportunity to go to Puerto Rico for several days before Thanksgiving to help prepare the church's holiday meal. Our son, Benjamin, flew her down. She had a wonderful time with Ben and the Church. Benjamin also visited us in Massachusetts for about ten days during Christmas. We had a wonderful time with him!

Earlier in November, we spent about a week with Nathaniel in Florida and enjoyed our time with him as well. He has finished his internship and is now back in Puerto Rico, working at Sprint, and living in cramped space with his brother. Benjamin will start his second semester at the University of Puerto Rico in Arecibo, studying Accounting.

Please pray that we will be able to raise the support we need to go back to Puerto Rico. While we have had tremendous meetings, we have just one new church and two that are increasing our support. We know that God will take care of us. I am praying that some churches will catch the burden for winning the Hispanic world for Christ. To do this, one of the most strategic cities to win would be San Juan. We also want to see many missionaries sent out from our island to the world.

We appreciate your faithfulness to us as we continue our travelling during furlough. May it be a time of spiritual refreshment, vital growth and filled with opportunities to witness to more people and see more churches partnering with us. God bless!
