Paul was a twenty-six year old young man. He came to church for the first time when Jerry was preaching at the church in Ohio. He came with his girlfriend and sat in the third row, right behind Liz. Paul and the girl spent their time joking about everything said in the message Jerry preached. Liz had never heard him give a clearer or better presentation of the Gospel plan of salvation.

When the invitation was given, Paul and his girlfriend were the first out the back door. It was sad indeed, yet Jerry could think of nothing but the hundreds who had done the same thing in our church in Puerto Rico. How many times he had preached his heart out, prayed and fasted for the people on our island. Yet time after time they thought they were already good enough and fine, though we knew differently.

By Tuesday, Paul was dead. He had already passed into the eternity he had only joked about less than forty-eight hours earlier. The message he mocked came home to roost. The Hell he joked about became his eternal home. How sad.

The pastor of the church and Jerry went to the hospital. Jerry again had the opportunity to share Christ with the family, all of which appeared to be lost. He also spoke privately with the girlfriend, asking her to not follow in Paul's path.

No one knows the day or the hour when they will breathe their last breath. We would like to think that, had Paul known what was going to happen, he would have received Christ as Savior. According to John 9, "*...the night cometh when no man can work.*" Also, our life is but a "*vapor*". The incident with Paul reminds us of the urgency with which we need to share the Gospel.

Through February, we have seen nineteen people saved; we just wish that Paul had been number twenty. We have also seen 100 people dedicate their lives to be missionaries within the next ten years. None of this would be possible without your prayers and support. We covet and appreciate each time our names are brought before God's throne.

Continue to pray for our boys. They are in Puerto Rico without us, which makes it hard on us, but we are doing what God wants.
